You can stream photos from various sources such as SmugMug and your home computer and view them full TV screen, which looks great.

Senior's Safety (Bryan Bodell)

Heather Mullan spoke to Bryan Bodell, Power Pioneers Senior Safety Chair about the many scams happening in our communities. Here are a few to watch out for:

BC Hydro - scammers are representing themselves as BC Hydro and threatening to disconnect your power unless money is paid in gift card / prepaid VIsa cards.

WestJet - callers saying you have won a trip and need to pay a deposit. If you refuse, you are transferred to a high-powered sales person.

BMO - you receive a letter from BMO with their logo asking for personal information.

CRA - offering huge tax refunds and wanting your SIN information. Sometimes includes a return envelope to assist you!

Facebook Messenger - Scammers are using Messenger to send a message from one of your contacts talking about large Government grants.

Data Breaches - Major retailers are getting their systems hacked and personal information such as credit card information is getting out. Check your statements and online or paper bills.
